



Northern Doctors Urgent Care (NDUC) is a not for profit, community benefit society which operates an efficient, safe and reliable out of hours service which consistently meets and exceeds the National Out of Hours Quality Requirements. NDUC provides 'out of hour's' (OoH) care for almost 1 million people living in Newcastle, North & South Tyneside and Northumberland, and 'in hours' services via Equitable Access Primary Medical Care Health Centres (EAPMC). We are expanding our well-established clinical team to enable us to meet a growing demand for our services.

GPs

We have opportunities for salaried and sessional GPs, to work from our central base in Gosforth, at our Urgent Care Centres (which are co-located with A & E Departments) and at our EAPMCs. We also provide level 2 and 3 A & E services in Alwick, Berwick and Hexham Hospitals.

Salaried posts could be offered for a minimum of 12 hours per week up to full time. We aim to allocate fixed shifts, although a degree of flexibility to cover holidays / sickness would be required. Salaried posts offer holidays pro rata, study leave and pro rata medical defence cover. They can be combined with existing in hours work.

Sessional posts are typically attractive to local GPs who would like to undertake the occasional flexible sessions.

Clinicians can choose to undertake telephone triage, visiting, or centre based shifts. Experience of GP OoH services is desirable but not essential. Pay rates are competitive and reflect the times of the shifts undertaken.

For clinicians interested in working at Hexham, A & E experience is essential.

RGNs

We have a well established nurse team which works alongside our GPs to provide vital medical & dental care. We are expanding our team of nurse triage advisors to add further dynamism to our service and have exciting opportunities for RGNs to provide skilled and effective telephone triage and self care advice, with the support of our clinical assessment software.

Annualised posts could be offered for a minimum of 4 hours per week and offer holidays pro rata.

Casual posts are typically attractive to local nurses who would like to undertake the occasional flexible sessions and holidays are accrued for the hours worked. Hours of work will be predominantly evenings, weekends and Bank Holidays and we offer a competitive hourly rate of pay.
